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SYNOPSIS

James Franco's *Sal* chronicles the final day in the life of actor Sal Mineo (Val Lauren), 1950's teen idol and an Academy Award[®] nominee for his roles in *Rebel Without a Cause* and *Exodus*. Almost two decades later, Mineo is no longer the marquee sensation he had once been — but after years of public struggles with drugs and alcohol, he has become open about his homosexuality and is finding his way to becoming the actor and director he has always wanted to be. Featuring a magnetic performance by Lauren, Franco's intimate portrait finds the human details in a larger-than-life Hollywood story.

JAMES FRANCO'S DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

In 1976 Sal Mineo was murdered in front of his apartment on Holloway Drive, one block away from Sunset Boulevard, in the heart of Hollywood. Sal was thirty-seven when he was murdered, and was on the cusp of a new upswing in his career. He had started as a child star and when he was fifteen acted opposite James Dean in *Rebel Without a Cause*, for which they were both nominated for Oscars[®] (Dean posthumously). As a young performer, Sal was incredibly successful, as both an actor and a singer, and then in his twenties, for a variety of reasons both in and out of his control, he lost the recognition he had enjoyed as a young man. He struggled through his twenties and thirties to work, never again achieving the level of success he once enjoyed.

He lived the common tragedy of so many creative people who are passionate about what they do and don't have an outlet for their work. But unto the end, Sal was fighting for freedom of expression, and for ways to create work that was exciting and new. When he was murdered the tabloid magazines groundlessly hinted that the murder might have involved drugs or a gay lover, and ever since the memories of Sal has been tied to such erroneous conjecture in bad faith. This film is a portrait of a sensitive and kind artist in his last hours. Its intent is to show a whole life in the course of one day, the last day of Sal Mineo's life.

BIOGRAPHIES

Val Lauren

Val Lauren most recently wrapped up the feature film, *The Last Knights* playing opposite Clive Owen and Morgan Freeman, for director Kazuaki Kiriya's theatrical release in 2014. He will next appear in *Int. Leather Bar* directed by James Franco and Travis Matthews, a re-imagining of the film *Cruising* starring Al Pacino, where he stars in Pacino's role. The film will release late 2013/ early 2013. Also in 2013, Val filmed the leading role in *Desires of the Heart*, an independent feature film directed by James Kicklighter.

Val made his theater director debut when he directed a sold out run of the critically acclaimed original play theater production, *No Way Around But Through*, written by Scott Caan and produced by Garry Marshall and Mike O'Malley. Val and Scott starred alongside Melanie Griffith, Bre Blair and Robyn Cohen.

He made his writing and film directorial debut with the 40 minute short film, *Help* about a man (played by Val) who one night sets out on a mission to save his dying Mother's life. *Help* was an official selection at numerous film festivals including the Hollywood Film Festival, Palm Springs International, Ashland Independent, Charleston International, Playhouse West Film Festival, and the Strasbourg International, earning Val awards in several categories including: Best Actor, Best Director, Best Screenplay, Best Picture and Audience Award for Best Picture. *Help* also won OpenFilm's short film competition, earning Val a financing and a production deal with the production company, James Caan and Robert Duvall.

Val's other credits include a supporting role in Phedon Papamichael's soon to be released *Lost Angeles* and guest stars on the season finale of "Hawaii 5-0", "Monk", "CSI NY", "Criminal Minds", and "24".

James Franco

James Franco's metamorphosis into the title role of the TNT biopic "James Dean" earned him career making reviews, as well as a Golden Globe[®] for Best Actor in a Motion Picture made for Television. He also received nominations for an Emmy[®] and Screen Actors Guild Award[®] for this memorable performance. Franco earned an Independent Spirit Award[®] for Best Male Lead as well as nominations for an Academy Award[®], a Golden Globe Award[®] and a Screen Actors Guild Award[®] and recognition from numerous critics' associations for his starring role in Danny Boyle's critically acclaimed drama *127 Hours*. His performance alongside Sean Penn in Gus Van Sant's *Milk* earned an Independent Spirit Award[®] for Best Supporting Actor and he was nominated for a Golden Globe[®] for his role in David Gordon Green's comedy *Pineapple Express*, where he starred opposite Seth Rogen. He is also known for his starring role as Harry Osbourne in Sam Raimi's *Spider-Man Trilogy*.

Franco most recently starred in the comedy *The End Of The World* with Seth Rogen, Jonah Hill and Danny McBride as well as Sam Raimi's *OZ: The Great And Powerful* and Harmony Korine's *Spring Breakers*. He will again co-star with Jonah Hill in *True Story* for New Regency and will also star in Paul Haggis' *The Third Person*. Franco's additional credits include Ryan Murphy's *Eat*, *Pray*, *Love* starring opposite Julia Roberts, Shawn Levy's comedy *Date Night*, Rob Epstein and Jeffrey Friedman's *Howl*, where he played the famous poet Allen Ginsberg, George C. Wolfe's *Nights In Rodanthe;* Paul Haggis' *In The Valley Of Elah*; Karen Moncrieff's ensemble drama *The Dead Girl*; Tommy O'Haver's drama *An American Crime*; John Dahl's *The Great Raid*; Robert Altman's *The Company*; as well as *City By The*

Sea opposite Robert DeNiro and the Martin Scorsese produced *Deuces Wild*. On television, he starred in the critically acclaimed series "Freaks And Geeks".

He wrote and directed *The Feast Of Stephen*, which premiered and won a Teddy award at the Berlin Film Festival. Additionally, Franco directed *Saturday Night*, a documentary on the week-long production of a "Saturday Night Live" episode, which originally premiered at SXSW and *The Clerks Tale*, which premiered at Cannes. Franco also wrote and directed a biography on poet Hart Crane called *The Broken Tower* which premiered at the 2011 Los Angeles Film Festival and directed *Sal*, a biography based on the life of Sal Mineo, which screened at the 2011 Venice Film Festival. He also recently produced *Kink*, a documentary that premiered at the 2013 Sundance Film Festival. Additionally, he directed and starred in William Faulkner's *As I Lay Dying* based on the classic novel, which premiered at the 2013 Cannes Film Festival and will be released this Fall, and starred in the film adaptation of Cormac McCarthy's *Child Of God*, which he also co-wrote and directed.

Vince Jolivette

In 2003, Vince teamed with actor James Franco and manager Miles Levy to form Rabbit Bandini, a production company focused on creating groundbreaking narrative, documentary and multimedia content. Recent projects include Harmony Konrine's *Spring Breakers, Lovelace*, starring Amanda Seyfried *,The Iceman*, starring Michael Shannon, and the SNL behind the scenes documentary, *Saturday Night*. Last August production was completed on *As I Lay Dying*, directed and starring James Franco, based on the novel by William Faulkner. *As I Lay Dying* premiered at the 2013 Cannes International Film Festival to rave reviews. Vince was a Producer on both *Child Of God*, which was an adaptation of Cormac McCarthy's acclaimed book by the same name and *Palo Alto* directed by Gia Coppola which was drawn from James Franco's book *Palo Alto Stories*. *Child Of God* and *Palo Alto* will have their International premiere at the 2013 Venice International Film Festival and their North American premiere at the 2013 Toronto Film Festival. Some other projects that are in post production are *Tar* based on a series of poems by C.K. Williams and *Bukowski* based on the early life of author Charles Bukowski.

Christian Olave

Cristian Olave is a Chilean born American actor, filmmaker and storyteller. He was raised in Miami, Florida and is fully bilingual in English and Spanish.

His training began at the American Conservatory Theatre under the tutelage of playwright, and pulitzer prize finalist, Amy Freed. Further studies continued at Playhouse West in Los Angeles, where he trained with Robert Carnegie and Jeff Goldblum.

As a producer, he has collaborated with Mark Greenberg ("Entourage") and Molly Conners (*Frozen River, Killer Joe*) on the award winning short film *Help* written and directed by Val Lauren and starring Lauren and Golden Globe[®] nominee Adam Beach.

Cristian's passion for the rich history and heritage of distilled spirits makes him a sought after spirits raconteur. He conducts seminars and tastings throughout the United States.

Stacey Miller

Originally from Texas, Stacey Miller began her career in Los Angeles as an actress, co-starring in numerous Rabbit Bandini productions including *The Ape, Good Time Max* and *The Broken Tower*. After completing USC's Master of Professional Writing program, her focus shifted almost exclusively to writing for film and television. Most recently, Stacey co-wrote and co-directed Rabbit Bandini's original series *Acting Class*. Stacey is currently at work on several upcoming projects.

Trevor Neuhoff

Trevor grew up in Boulder, Colorado and moved to Chattanooga, Tennessee for high school. Once there, he began to train in the theatre, completing ten productions over the four years. He studied undergraduate film at New York University, and was fortunate enough to act in independent features during that time -- John Henry Summerour's "Sahkanaga", as well as numerous other shorts and art projects. Upon recently finishing his degree, Trevor made the cross country move from New York to Los Angeles.

PRODUCTION COMPANY BIOGRAPHY

Founded in 2003 by James Franco, Vince Jolivette, and James' manager Miles Levy, RABBIT BANDINI PRODUCTIONS has established a successful track record of making films that have performed financially, creatively and commercially both within the independent filmmaking community as well as in conjunction with major studios and foreign sales corporations.

The company played an invaluable role in bringing the creative vision to the screen while supervising physical production. Other notable producing credits include *Springbreakers* starring Selena Gomez, Vanessa Hudgens, Ashley Benson and James Franco; a biopic on Linda Lovelace, *Lovelace*, starring Amanda Seyfried, Sarah Jessica Parker and Peter Sarsgaard; and *The Iceman* about notorious hit man Richard Kuklinski.

Rabbit Bandini currently has 2 films in post-production; *Tar* starring Franco, Mila Kunis, Jessica Chastain and Zach Braff, and *Bukowski* about the early years of the poet Charles Bukowski's life. Rabbit Bandini's adaptation of William Faulkner's *As I Lay Dying* (directed by and starring Franco) premiered at the 2013 Cannes Film Festival and the adaptation of Cormac McCarthy's acclaimed book *Child Of God* (directed by Franco) is going to premiere internationally at the 2013 Venice Film Festival as well as have its North American premiere at the 2013 Toronto Film Festival.
